No. 1, WELCOME—The Headmaster would like to welcome to Sanawar all members of the Staff and the children, and would like to wish them a very happy and successful term in School.

No. 2, SCHOOL PROGRAMME—All departments will observe Sunday timings till March 4th. Assembly on 24th, 26th and 27th February will be at 9-45 a. m. Prep. and P. T. will start on and from Monday, 12th March. Supper will be at 5-45 p. m. daily.

No. 3, TEXT BOOKS AND STATIONERY—After Assembly and the reading of the Form Lists on February 24th, children, under Form Staff, will assemble in their Form Rooms. Text Books only will be issued.

Subject Masters will be responsible for issuing the required number of text books and exercise books to their Forms. If more than one text book is prescribed for English the minimum requirement will be issued. Subsequent issues will be made when the preliminary issue is returned to the Stock Room.

Subject Masters will keep a record of text books issued to the children, and will record the state of the books issued (i. e. old, new) on the special Form supplied by the Librarian. This procedure is important, as recoveries will have to be effected at the end of the year from the children concerned if books have been misused or mutilated.

Form Staff will collect their requirements of stationery from the Librarian in the first School on 26th February, after Assembly.

No. 4, PROCEDURE—On arrival all old children will report to the Matrons concerned and hand over their medical slips to them. These medical slips will be forwarded to the R. M. O. by the House Masters/Mistresses on 22nd February, 1962. Any children without medical slips or who appear unwell on arrival will be sent to the R. M. O. This applies in particular to children who has coughs and colds

Spraying of throats will be done daily until further orders. R. M. O. will organise this.

No. 5, RECEPTION—New admissions will be made on 24th, 26th, 27th, 28th, February and 1st, 2nd and 3rd March,. All new parents on their arrival will be guided to the Parents' Rooms. Hot water and tea will be made available for them on their arrival. Quartermaster will arrange for hot water, and Mrs. Sehgal for tea, in the Parents' Rooms.

Mr. Pillai will be on duty from 9-00 a. m. to 1-00 p. m. in the Parents' Rooms to guide the parents on the Reception dates.

From the Parents' Rooms, parents, together with their luggage, will be taken to the Office. From there children will be directed to the Deputy Headmaster in the case of Senior School, and to the Mistress I/C Prep. School in the case of children for admission to the Prep. School, for an interview and test. Miss Rudra will arrange for children to be tested in the School office. If found suitable for admission in the Forms allotted, parents will complete all financial and other formalities in the School Office. Thereafter children will be taken to the R. M. O. for medical inspection, and if found fit, will proceed to their respective dormitories.

No. 6, LATE ARRIVALS—All Housemasters/Housemistresses are requested to report late arrivals, among the older children, together with their explanations for late arrival. If children arrive late for reasons which are not covered by a Medical Certificate or the Headmaster's sanction, disciplinary action will be taken against them as under :—

- (1) They will be denied WOPs for the whole of March.
- (2) They will be denied pocket money till the end of the month.
- (3) They will not be permitted to attend any cinema shows till the end of the month.

Dhobi shortages on account of dhobi washes or damage done to clothing by dhobies must be reported in writing to the office forthwith and the signature of the dhobi obtained on the dhobi-account book.

No newly admitted child will be granted WOPs, nor will their parents be permitted to visit them, until the 3rd Sunday of April, namely Sunday, the 15th April. This will give these children time in which to settle down. This must be explained to parents or guardians when they arrive.

No. 16, DOGS—All dogs must be registered immediately. Steps are being taken to remove all stray dogs by the end of this week. All servants have been informed that they lay themselves open to serious action if any unregistered dogs are found around their quarters.
