(4) The Havelock Crest will be secured for the House as soon as possible, if the head of the Havelock family gives permission for it to be used.

(5) This new development will enable Houses to foster the growth of House loyalty and ESPRIT-DE-CORPS to a greater degree than was possible when the Houses only had games to keep them together. Heads of Houses and Senior Girls in Houses will be able to feel in a new way a very definite sense of responsibility towards the younger ones in their Houses. The younger ones will be in bed and I hope asleep by time the elder ones get to bed. It will obviously be up to the elder ones to get to bed as quietly and quickly as possible so as not to disturb the younger ones.

(6) Under the new arrangement the three House Matrons will beresponsible for two Houses each and the closest co-operation will be maintained between House Mistresses, House Matrons and the Senior Girls.

(7) Further schemes to develop House consciousness and solidity will be developed by the Head Mistress and Staff.

(8) I wish the new scheme every success but this will only be reached by every member of the House obeying, working and playing in a cheerful and unselfish spirit. The good name of the House. must be paramount. Every girl must do her best for the House in. every way. She must make the best of herself in and out of School in. order that she may have something really to contribute to the good of her House.

(9) May Houses be very happy, very obedient and very cheerful in all that they do.
