- 2 When Wards are given permission to go to Kasauli they will go through and return without stopping in the Sanawar Bazaar or in Gharkal.
- 3 The Sanawar Bazaar and Dharampore are only in bounds for Wards if they are with their people or a member of the Staff. Wards with passes to Kasauli may go through Sanawar Bazaar going and returning.
- 4 The "Long Back Way" and the Girls' School side of Sanawar, including the P. D. and Crêche, are at all times out of bounds for B. D., unless boys have passes to see parents, or are running Hodson Runs with permission.
- 5 When the Head Master or Head Mistress give permission, on holidays, to roam over the country side, the Boys' School "roaming bounds" are bounded by the "Horseshoe," the "Bridle Track" to "Dharampore" as far as the Kalka-Simla motor-road, the motor-road from there to Gharkal, and the motor-road from "Gharkal" to "Sanawar". Wards from Havelock House (B. D.) are not allowed roaming bounds.

The Girls' School "roaming bounds" are from "Peacestead" to the "Short Back Way" down "Donkey's Slant" or along the "Short Back Way" to old "Graveyard Corner" and down "Hodson's Slant". Girls may not go round the corner of the "Short Back Way" under the Christian quarters. They may play on the hill side between these two paths.

From "Donkey's Slant" their bounds extend along the "Long Back Way" to "Lovers' Hill." They may go up the hill to Crater, and all along the tops of the hills there, but not down into the valley beyond the road. From time to time I have occasion to draw attention to things that happen in Sanawar which are not worthy of her. The Durrant Society Meeting last night is one of them. It was a badly arranged, undignified meeting on a thoroughly low level and I felt anything but proud of the Society and its School members.

I make the following criticisms:-

- (1) When I brought the Lecturer into the Hall I thought that the Society would be ready for us and that members would stand up. The Secretary was not there: no one took the slightest notice when we came in but continued sitting down. It should be remembered that a Lecturer who gives up his time to prepare a lecture for the Society honours them by his presence and should be treated with the respect which is customary in societies of this kind.
- (2) Most members were sitting at the back of the room leaving a large gap of several rows of vacant chairs. They were obviously much more interested in each other than in the lecture. The impression created in my mind was that they wished to be left alone and to have nothing to do with the older members of the Society, an entirely wrong point of view when all members of the Durrant Society, young and old, should meet in equal fellowship. The gap was a symbol of something that should never be. When I suggested moving up only a few took any notice and then moved up with what appeared to me a sullen look as if they resented my suggestion. I wished to save the Society from the disgrace which the Lecturer subsequently inflicted on them by asking members after he had begun his lecture to move up closer so that they could see and hear.
- (3) The behaviour of the Society during the lecture was on a very low level. A lecturer hopes for an expects laughs and applause at intervals but it is customary when these have taken place for an audience to become quiet again immediately in order that others at any rate may be able to hear. I felt a feeling of disgrace when I had to get up twice and turn round in order to get members quiet and allow the Lecturer to resume. It struck me forcibly looking round on those two occasions that the membership is far too large. Many obviously have not the remotest idea what the Society stands for. They still breathe the atmosphere of a "gaff" and are therefore as yet unsuitable members of such a Society as the Durrant Society. There are still quite a number who are inclined to giggle when they say adsum.

We started shakily and I had my doubts about the side. The form in the earlier matches showed that those doubts were well-founded. The captain and the XI came in for much searching criticism but stood the severe test remarkably well and finish the season one of the strongest sides we have ever had in Sanawar cricket. This result I put down to a willingness to learn, an ability to stand criticism and profit by it and the way the old colours who were, with one exception, the most junior members of last year's XI, did what was expected of them and improved their game so tremendously that they took the places of the old stalwarts, who were the backbone of the side last year. In the end we hardly noticed the disappearance of so many well-known cricketers from the School team. A special word of praise must be given to the Captain who undertook his responsible duties with courage and keenness: he studied the game and took heed to the coaches, incidentally improving his own game considerably.

The side contained some feeble members who did not even field well. They must consider themselves fortunate to get into a School XI of a strength above the average. The fact that they could be carried as passengers indicates the strength of the side.

Many records were broken which will duly be recorded in our Cricket annals. I am glad that my last year has proved so successful, and hope that Sanawar cricket will continue to flourish in the future.

Sanawarians must always remember that our ability to play good cricket has grown up because Eanawar loys have proved themselves to be men on the cricket field; keen enough to put all their energies into learning the game well; humble enough to know that however well they play cricket, they are still only novices in the great game; of good enough stuff enough to stand up to criticism and not to resent it even when it is straight and unsparing; and lastly, fit enough to be able to stand the strain of a full day's cricket without tiring.

It is no longer a dividing line between boys of standing in the School and boys of none. The following order is therefore published to restore the Club to its original prestige and to safeguard its future.

1. The Head of the School is President of the Club and the other Heads of Houses form the rest of the Committee. If the School Captain of cricket, football or hockey does not happen to be the Head of a House he will also be on the Committee. A Secretary will be elected annually, or as occasion demands, by this Committee

from among their own number.

2. The Head Master will select one of his Staff to act as advisor

to the Committee.

3. Membership will be strictly by election by the Committee. The voting must be unanimous. If a candidate's name is objected to by any member of the Committee his name will be cancelled.

4. No name may be proposed for the Club by any member who

is not a member of the Committee.

5. The Committee will be guided in their choice of members to share with them the privileges of the Club by the selection only of

boys of standing in the School.

- 6. The Membership is confined to 35. If for any reason the Committee wishes to exceed this number written permission must be obtained from the Principal and the name of the candidate or candidates sent up in writing to the Principal signed by the President and every member of the Committee.
 - 7. The maximum number of the membership need not neces-

sarily be filled if suitable candidates are not available.

- 8. The Committee has power to suspend members, temporarily or permanently, if for any reason they consider them unworthy of membership in the Club.
- 9. Members will be required to pay four annas per month for membership. The income from subscriptions to be used for the

benefit of members as their Committee shall direct.

- 10. The Library arrangements will be improved. One of the Committee will be elected as Librarian and will keep the key of the book cases. Books will not leave the Club Room unless the Librarian enters the name of the borrower and the book, with the date, in the book provided for the purpose. All books will be marked with the Club label.
- 11. Arrangements will be made for magazines and papers which will be sent to Hospital when finished with. The magazines and papers will be kept in cardboard covers.

12. Arrangements will also be made for indoor games.

13. It is expected that the behaviour of all members should be such as membership in the Lawrence Club demands.

14. The member of the Staff referred to in paragraph 2 is a

member of the Committee.

15. Before the Christmas holidays begin the President of the Club will insure holiday arrangements which will prevent any but members using the Club.

No. 546, ARMS—The following Press Communique is published. The Punjab Government have reason to believe that a considerable number of persons residing in the Punjab have in their possession unlicensed fire-arms which they have not declared, either owing to the rick of prosecution or through ignorance of the rules of the subject. As it is essential that Government should have accurate information regarding the total number of fire-arms in the possession of the public, they have decided to make an appeal to all possessors of unlicensed weapons to deliver their weapons on the following conditions:—

- (1) No presecution will be instituted under the Indian Arms Ac or the Rules framed thereunder against any person who on or before the 31st of October 1932, either deposits hi unlicensed weapons at a police station, or furnishes accurate information regarding them to any District Magistrat in the Punjab.
- (2) Applications for the grant of licences received from such persons on or before the 31st of October 1932 will be considered on their merits, and, if a licence is granted, the applicant will be charged only the fee for the current year no claim being made for arrears.
- (3) Any such persons who do not desire to take out a licence of to whom a licence cannot be granted, will be required to deposit their weapons, if they have not already done so, a the nearest police station. If the weapons are deposited before the 31st of October 1932, or within one week of the receipt of intimation that a licence cannot be granted, the proceeds of their sale will be credited to the depositor.
- (4) After the 31st of October 1932 prosecutions will be launched against any and every person found in unlawful possession of any weapon for which he is required by the rules to take out a licence: provided that this period may be extended in the case of any persons who would otherwise avail them selves of this offer but are prevented from doing so by absence from the province, or by any other good and sufficient reason.
- (5) Exemptees who have ommitted to comply with the provision of rule 3(b) of the Indian Arms Rules will not be prosecut ed for such omission if they register the fire-arms in thei possession with the District Magistrate on or before the 31st of October 1932. After that date any exemptee who fails to register his weapons will be liable to prosecution under the Indian Arms Act, and also to cancellation of his exemption.

Information regarding exemption from the provision of the Indian Arms Act and Rules in regard to fire-arms.

As many persons appear to be unfamiliar with the rules regardiexemption, the following summary is published for gener information :-

- 1. The only persons who are entirely exempt from the provision of the Indian Arms Act are Ruling Princes or Chiefs of Indi States and such members of their families or retinues as may granted exemption by the Government of India or by the Loc Government.
- 2. Officers of the Army and Air Force are entirely exempt respect of the following fire-arms only, which have been declared form part of their military equipment :-

Officers holding Commissions from His Majesty the King-

2 revolvers or 2 pistols or 1 of no special pattern but one revolver and 1 pistol. ment ammunition of 455 bore

Officers holding Commissions from His Excellency the Viceroy-1 revolver (Webley 455 bore).

- 3. The following persons are not required to take out a licenfor any weapon, but are required to furnish to the District Magistra of the district in which they reside a list showing the number as description of arms in their possession, and to inform the Distri Magistrate in writing of any increase or decrease of such numb within a month of the date on which such increase or decrease tak place:
 - (a) His Excellency the Governor; Members and Ministers of the Local Government: Judges of the High Court; Financial Commissioners.
 - (1) Such Sardars and Jagirdars of the Punjab as have bee designated by the Local Government in this behalf.
- 4. The following persons enjoy the same exemption as the person specified in clause (3) in respect of certain weapons only. For a other weapons they must take out licenses in accordance with th usual rules :-
 - (a) Certain members of His Majesty's Military Forces,—(ria entries (8) and (9) in Schedule I of the Indian Arms Rules in respect of the following weapons:-
 - (i) single-barrel rifles of 303 bore required for match shooting purposes and forming part of the equip ment of the Corps to which they belong; and
 - (ii) arms and ammunition provided for sporting purpose by Government from regimental funds under th authority of the Officer Commanding the Unit.
 - (b) Persons holding fire-arms received as gifts from th Governor-General in Council, or from a Local Government or from the Commander-in-Chief in respect of the fire-arm so received.

Extraordinarily few boys have realized and made use of straight hitting. The straight left has been, except in one or two cases, conspicuous by its absence. Nearly every boy seems to imagine that round arm swinging (which often ends up inevitably with an open glove) is the way to box. Nothing could be more mistaken. The straight left is as important in boxing as the straight bat is in cricket. Sanawar cricketers have learnt how to sum up a visiting batsman very quickly and when an obvious cricketer comes in who lifts his bat in the right way and brings it straight and hard to meet the ball, they know that there is trouble ahead and the visitor will take some getting out.

The boxers have not learnt their lesson yet. I was very disappointed to notice that even some of our boxers from the champion class had deteriorated in this way and showed a type of boxing that was definitely on a low level. Of course the usual Sanawar spirit characterised the tournament: pluck, determination, the N. G. I. attitude which is our primary characteristic as a School (the inheritance which every Sanawarian takes to himself or herself as soon as he or she breathes our mountain air)—all these things were present as they always are: but art was often lacking and we should do well to set our house in order in this respect. Sanawarians will bear in mind that we did not beat Bishop Cotton School last year and that this year the annual boxing match is at Simla. Copy only the best models and remember that straight hitting wins the day. It is powerful and of course so much quicker than round arm hitting. Remember that a straight line and not an arc is the shortest distance between two points.

- 1. Founder's Week will be from October 3rd to 8th October, with Founder's Day on the first Thursday in October (October 6th.) His Excellency General Sir Philip W. Chetwode, Bart. G.C.B., K.C.M.G., D.S.O., Commander-in-Chief in India will preside.
- 2. The following procedure will be adopted with reference to the eliminating heats for the sports:—
- 3. In the Field Events the 4 competitors will be left in for the Finals who have put up the best performance (3 tries each being allowed).
- 4. In the track events and hurdles. The names of all competitors will be put into a hat. They will be drawn five at a time on the ground and the competitors will first run in heats of these 5. The names of the first three in each heat will be taken. The surviving names will form the next unit to be dealt with, either on the same day or, if possible, on another day. The names will again be drawn in fives and heats run off, the first three names being taken. This process will be continued till it is possible to get down to two heats when 4 names (the first two in each heat) only will remain in for all races up to and including the 440. (For the girls' 440 eight names will be left in.) For the 880 and 1 mile 8 names will be left in. If numbers are not an exact multiple of 5, some of the heats may contain more than 5. Two examples are given in illustration:—
- (a) 23 entries for 100 yards. 4 heats of 5, 6, 6, 6. Number left in 12. Two heats of 6 each numbers left in for final 4 (first 2 from each heat),
- (b) 37 entries for the 880. 7 heats of 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 6, 6. Number left in 21. 4 heats of 5, 5, 5, 6. Number left in 12. Two heats of 6 each. Numbers left in for final 8 (four from each heat).
- 5. To insure the proper number of competitors actually appearing in all Finals on the day of the Sports one reserve name for each event will be taken and printed on the programme. This will cover possible emergent casualties. Every event must have its proper number of starters.
- 6. As the Athletic Meetings have now been established for some time and records are none too easy to beat, all record breakers will score 5 points if the "R" flag is hoisted on their behalf. These points will count for Cock House and for the Athletic Medal in both Schools. They will count in the Hodsons. If the second or third (or any place) competitor breaks the record, points will be scored both for the Cock House and the Athletic Medal.
 - 7. The same will also apply in the Aquatic Sports.
- 8. In future, as the Relay Race in the Sports is a combined effort representing many runners, it will score 20, 10 and 5 points for Houses for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. This will also apply to the Aquatic Sports.

When flowering has finished the long stems should be cut right off as near the bottom as possible. The young plants growing round the old stem should be watered (but not overwatered). Pots should be left out in the cold. Chrysanthemums are hardy plants and snow and frost does them good. By the end of February the young plants should be ready to be separated and replanted. If long plants are required and small flowers the small plants should be put in with the young root. If larger blooms are required the roots should be cut off and the cuttings put in about three inches long. These should be kept well watered till they have taken when a strong and vigorous plant should be the result of slow and steady growth during the summer and monsoon.

- 1. All members of the Staff leaving Sanawar for the holidays will leave their addresses in my Office. It is essential that I should know the addresses of all members of the Staff in case it is necessary to correspond with them. An address book will be prepared in the Office.
- 2. Keys of quarters are to be handed in at my Office. Keys should be labelled with owner's name.
- 3. The quarters are to be left in such a state that it may be possible to white wash the walls, carry out necessary repairs to floors, fire places, walls and windows.
- 4. All furniture in quarters will be checked by the occupant and left so as to be checked officially afterwards.
- 5. Coolies for Staffs will not be available on the 20th instant. Any heavy baggage for Dharampore may be sent on the Lorry with the Wards' luggage.

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS—ORDERS FOR WARDS—

1. A special train will leave Dharampore at 15-00 hours on the 20th December. Only Wards whose parents actually come up and fetch them will be allowed to go before 11-30 hours.

Buns and Cocoa will be provided in kitchens between 11-30—12-30 hours for all children. Hot dinner will be provided for those staying in Sanawar at 18-30 hours on the 20th December.

The attention of all subscribers to the General Provident Fund is drawn to the following ruling, received under Military Accountant General's No. 2036-At., dated 22nd November, 1932, on the subject of conversion of insurance policies, after their assignment to the Secretary of State, into "paid-up" policies :-

"The Finance Department, to which the matter was referred for a ruling, have decided that there is no objection to a subscriber being allowed to convert a policy effected under Rule 21 of the General Provident Fund into a "paid-up" policy, provided that, if the sum of the amounts withdrawn by him from the Fund for the payment of premia (without interest), exceeds the paid-up value of the policy, the difference shall be recovered from him and credited to his General Provident Fund account. Cases in which it is considered that the recovery of the whole difference in a single instalment will cause hardship to the individual concerned, should be submitted for the orders of the Government of India, as and when they arise, the number of instalments in which it is proposed to effect recovery being indicated.

They have also decided that the amount of any interim bonus should not be taken into consideration, as it is not usually guaranteed and is not included in the amount of the policy which the Company is bound to pay.

- 2. In such cases, after the Insurance Company has made necessary entries on the policy, an endorsement signed by the parties should be made thereon to the effect that the policy has been converted into a "paid-up" policy with the consent of Government, and that such conversion does not affect Government's lien on the proceeds of the policy.
- 3. From the date of payment of premia towards the "paid-up" policy cases, the individual, if a compulsory subscriber to the Fund, must, of course, start or renew subscriptions to the Fund." (A 1/12).
