The Governor-General in Council announces with the deepest regret the demise of His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Defender of the Faith, and Emperor of India.

The Governor-General in Council hereby directs that the Officers of His Majesty's Civil, Naval, Military and Air Force Services do put themselves into mourning until further orders.

The Governor-General in Council requests that a similar mark of respect may, on this most melancholy occasion, be observed by all other classes of British subjects in India.

The flags on all Ships and all Ports and Stations will be hoisted "Half mast high" until further orders. 70 minute guns will be fired in all stations where facilities exist on 22nd January commencing at 8 hrs.

Officers in mufti will conform to the above instructions as far as possible."
