Fuel may be issued for the various House-room fires daily from the 24th onwards where necessary: matrons should apply to the office the day before such fires are required.

- No. 28, BEDS—There are six types of bed in use in the school.
- (1) Those designed for the boys, sometimes called the "platform" bed.
- (2) Those designed for the girls, purchased originally from a British hospital, and for that reason sometimes called in Sanawar the "hospital" or "long" beds.
- (3) The "wide" beds, recently purchased commercially from Rawalpindi.
- (4) The "J. S." beds purchased from England.
- (5) The "lengthened" J. S. beds, being the original J. S. beds with a piece added in our own workshops.
- (6) There are also the "Staff" beds generally a rigid type, purchased commercially.

The policy towards which the School is working is as follows:-

- (a) The five Upper School boys' dormitories should be equipped exclusively with bed No. 1, that is the "platform" bed.
- (b) The two Lower School boys' dormitories should be equipped with the "lengthened" J. S. beds, plus a few J. S. beds (unlengthened) beds possibly for the very smallest boys, plus a few No. 1 beds for bigger boys sleeping in those dormitories. There are not at present enough "lengthened" beds to equip both the Lower School dormitories but this will be carried out as soon as labour is available.
- (c) The four Upper School Girls' dormitories will be equipped as they are, for the most part already, with bed No. 2 plus a few "wide" beds No. 3, for their smaller girls.

- (d) The two Lower School girls' dormitories will be equipped eventually with "lengthened" beds No. 5, and the "wide" beds, about half and half.
- (e) The J. S. will be equipped with J. S. beds throughout, either the original small bed or else the lengthened ones for their bigger children. There should not be any need for anything bigger than the lengthened beds in the Junior School.

Matrons and others will therefore help considerably if they will kindly work towards the above scheme. The present situation is that there are ample numbers of No. 1 and there is no need to obtain any more either now or for the future. There are some 180 J S, beds in all and the lengthening of these should be proceeded with more rapidly, the surplus No. 1 beds being cut up for the purpose. Any new purchases will be of the Number S type as being much more suitable for the size of girl the school mostly takes in now-a-days than the unnecessarily long "hospital" beds.

Where new beds are required for Staff, the "Staff" beds in girls' dermitories should first be drawn on; there are a few of these, for some reason or other, in dormitories. Further requirements should be met by providing the Staff with the Girls' long beds, and replacing the beds so withdrawn from dormitories with the "wide" beds of which there is a small surplus.

The above policy should be applied as flowers now in gardens die down and the A.G. E. wishes it to be completed within the next three or four weeks.

- 2. In addition, the air mail fee on letters addressed to a member of His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces who, being an Indian, is stationed in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, has also been reduced from 14 annas to 8 annas per half ounce.
