No. 213, ACADEMIC:--

- (a) Syllabuses. Masters/Mistresses I/C. Subjects will recast syllabuses with the answers to the following questions in mind:—
- (i) Is, the syllabus suited to the level of understanding and capacity to retain of the age groups represented in the various forms? This applies in particular to the lower forms.
- (ii) Would it not be better to go easy in the lower forms and speed up later than to do too much earlier on with the later burden of revising what was never properly assimilated?
- (iii) Is there enough time allotted for revision? The principle that revision should be spaced rather than concentrated should be accepted.
- (iv) Is the syllabus in sufficient detail? Is there contained in it enough to guide inexperienced and/or untrained teachers in the preparation of lesson notes?
  - (v) Does the syllabus contain enough information with regard to text books, reference books. charts, visual and aural aids, suggestions with regard to teaching methods, etc., again with a view to assisting the Teachers?

Masters/Mistresses are requested to complete this work by 15th November, 1956, and thereafter to hand draft syllabuses to the Senior Master and Senior Mistress as under:--

> Biology, Physics, Chemistry General Science and Mathematics to the Senior Master.

English, History, Geography, Hindi, Art, Music and Domestic Science to the Senior Mistress.

The Senior Master and Senior Mistress will examine the syllabuses so submitted and make such revisions, alterations and amenda ments as they consider suitable, perferably in consulation with the Master/Mistresses I/C Syllabuses. Sufficient copies of the syllabuses finally approved will be printed in readiness for the term commencing March, 1957.

(b) Text Books. Masters/Mistresses I/C Subjects will submit to to the Senior Mistress by 15th November, 1956, their recommendations with regard to text books, reference books, maps, charts, equipment, etc. In order to effect economy due regard will be paid to the suitablity of existing books in use.

They will also inform the Senior Mistress of the estimated number of reusable or repairable text books available. This return will be submitted by 15th Novemder, 1956. It will be only approximate as the true position will only be known after the end of term.

The Senior Mistress will coordinate recommendations and present a consolidated demand for books required on the Bursar not later than the end of term. The guiding principle should be that there must be enough copies for every child plus a 25% reserve.

- (c) Library. The Senior Mistress will study the situation with regard to the library and make such recommendations as she considers suitable. The guiding principles should be that there should be available :--
  - (i) A Reference Library both for teachers and children.
  - (ii) Enough books appealing to children of all ages the object being not so much to instruct but to entertain thereby developing in the child a habit of reading.

No. 228, PREFECTS' COUNCIL—A Prefects' Council composed of all School Prefects will be set up with effect from Monday, 5th November, 1956. Normally Girls will meet separately from . oys. In exceptional cases, however, when the interests of the whole School are affected, there will be a joint sitting of the full Council.

The sole aim of the Council will be the maintenance of a code of honour and conduct as understood by the children themselves. Bullying, lying and cheating for selfish reasons, misappropriation, lack of esprit de corps unseemly behaviour, wilful defiance of authority, are examples of what the Prefects' Council will deal with.

The spirit in which these cases are to be dealt with will be reformative and not retaliatory. There will be no ganging up against any one. The purpose of the Council is to set the tone and to enforce its maintenance.

School policy, staff and School administration are matters outside the scope of the Council.

The Council will meet once a week, on Sundays, after breakfast. It may meet at any time in an emergency.

The Council may on its own initiative, or on a representation made to it by a child consider any matter jeopardising the accepted code of honour and conduct. The Council will also consider any representation submitted to it against a member of the Council itself. There will be no delay in effecting these hearings.

Proceedings of the Council may be open or secret as the Council decides. The decision of the Council must be by unanimous vote. In case the conduct of a member of the Council is under consideration, such member will not vote.

No punishment will be awarded by the Council unless the offender and witnesses if any have been given a hearing.

The Council may award the following punishments which will be administered by the Head Boy in the case of boys and the Head Girl in the case of girls.

- (a) Severe reprimand
- (b) Two strokes of the cane. (Boys only)
- (c) Deprivation of the appointment of House or School Prefect. This last will be in the form of a recommendation to the **Head**master.

There will be no appeal against a decision of the Council.
